DRAMA WITH ROS

Drama classes are currently being delivered to 3rd and 4th classes by Ros Coyne of 'Tegolan Theatre'. Under Ros' direction, the children are exploring their expressions of themselves via movement and speech. Using a variety of drama exercises the children are encouraged to develop specific skills such as listening and oral language. Though children love to perform, it is not our objective that theses classes end in a one off production. However, they are producing wonderful presentations in small groups in the hall. 4th class have chosen to develop their project about Gráinne Mhaol in dramatic terms thereby entering into a deeper understanding of that moment in History. 4th class are engaged in improvisation on selected pieces of poetry.

STANDARDISED TESTING

Classes from First to Sixth will begin their standardised tests in English and Maths from the 23rd of April. A standardised test is a test that measures a child's achievement compared to other children in all schools at the same class or age level. We will send out end of year reports in early June. The report card will be the same as the one used last year. It will include the results of the standardised tests which will be described as a 'STen score'. STen scores go from 1 to 10. About one third of children have scores in the average range of STen score 5 and 6. A STen of 7 means that the child is a high average and a STen score of 8-10 mean that the child is well above average. A Sten score of 4 means that the child is a low average and a Sten score of 1-3 is a score well below average.

It is important to remember that no matter what score a child gets one score taken in isolation is not a complete picture of a child's learning in that particular subject.

We will send an information leaflet for parents in relation to standardised testing and STen scores with each child's report. Parents are welcome to make an appointment to discuss the reports with the relevant teachers if they wish. Please note that these Standardised tests are taking place earlier than usual in the school year and this may adversely affect the outcomes.

SCHOOL BAND
