Active School Week

Scoil Mhuire Active School week will take place from Monday 20th June to Friday 25th. They participated in the Senior competition and their performance included singing, dancing, story-telling and music playing. The performance lasted around 30 minutes. There were 42 participants in their group with the youngest being 11 years of age and quite a few adults.

The Scoil Mhuire participants won the Senior All Ireland Title for Plearacha 2016.

There was great celebrations afterwards with a convoy around town and bonfires to welcome them home.

This is a wonderful achievement and we at Scoil Mhuire are very proud of these gifted students. Scoil Mhuire and residents of Clúid are celebrating Intergenerational Day 2016 on Wednesday 11th May. The older generation will demonstrate some of the old crafts and in return, senior class students will organise a short concert in the afternoon. Invitations will be sent out soon.

Cycle Training

Cycle training will take place for Sixth class on Thursday the 19th of May. This will teach students safe cycling techniques and open participants to the option of an invaluable and inexpensive form of exercise at a time when lack of exercise is a cause for concern. All the equipment will be supplied including bicycles.

Transition programme and visit to the Community school

Sixth class were extremely fortunate to work with Fergal Clancy-a mentor . Fergal works with many primary and post primary schools in the surrounding areas. He is dealing with many areas with the pupils from Scoil Mhuire, including transition to secondary school and making this transition as smooth as possible. Fergal also looks at respect, respecting ourselves and others. The children did a lot of work on self-help tips about dealing with difficult situations and the appropriate procedures to help you overcome these situations. The students of Scoil Mhuire are really enjoyed these sessions and are gained great coping skills and life skills as a result.

As part of this transition programme, Sixth class will be visiting the Community school on Wednesday the 18th of May.

Holy Communion

As you know First Communion will be held on Saturday May 21st at 11.00 a.m.in St. Joseph's Church, Clifden. The children are busy preparing for the sacrament, doing their bible stories, learning their prayers, hymns and the mass responses. They will be going to the church next week for practice and we would welcome parents to come and help with supervision going to and from the church.

First Communion is always a beautiful ceremony and everyone remembers their own day. The children in Scoil Mhuire in third, fourth, fifth and sixth classes have been the main Choir members for the last few years. Each year they have been wonderful and have added so much to the ceremony. At school we are busy preparing the choir hymns with the senior classes. This will make the First Communion all the more special for the boys and girls and indeed their families and friends. The more children we have in the Choir the better! Stay Safe Programme

Teachers in Scoil Mhuire are going to be teaching a personal safety education programme called Stay Safe to all classes in our school. The aim of the Stay Safe programme is to teach children personal safety skills so they can look after themselves in situations which could be upsetting or dangerous. It deals initially with common situations which most children will experience at some stage or other, e.g. getting lost or being bullied. The programme also teaches children the safety skills necessary to protect themselves from physical or sexual abuse.
