Attendance

The vast majority of pupils in Scoil Mhuire have satisfactory attendance patterns. At the end of each term many children received certificates for excellent and very good school attendance. Other children get awards for improved attendance. Attending school regularly is really important to give every child the best opportunity to make friends and to learn. While the vast majority of children attend school regularly there is a group of children who were absent for twenty days of more during the last school year. In real terms this meant that they were absent for one day in every nine days or more.

Whenever a child is absent parents should send in a written note with the dates and reason for the absence to the class teacher. The school is obliged by law to keep a record of attendance and absences and to report absences and the reasons for the absences to TUSLA (previously the National Educational Welfare Board) in cases where the number of absences is more than twenty days in a school year or when there are serious concerns about absences from school. Parents may use the absence note forms in the homework journals. Where a child is sick he/she should not be at school and should be at home until he/she is well enough to return.
