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NEWSLETTER 3 - November 2017

MindUp

Staff have completed the first half of their MindUp training and are ready to start introducing the concepts to the children. We will endeavour to cover the first 3 lessons before the Christmas break.

Lesson 1 focusses on how the brain works. Children will be introduced to the three main areas that control emotions and responses— the amygdala, the hippocampus and the prefrontal cortex. This will help them understand how their brain works under pressure and enable children to be able to discuss what is happening in their brains.

Lesson 2 will focus on Mindful Awareness. This allows children to focus on the here and now in a considerate and non-judgemental way. Evidence has shown that learning to be mindfully in tune with what's happening in the moment helps them to make good choices, rather than being ruled by their emotions.

Lesson 3 will review the Brain breaks and allow children the space to understand why we are doing them. We began the Brain breaks with children today. Three times a day we allow a space to focus on our breathe. A chime is rung in each class at a specific time and the children are instructed how to focus on the here and now. We will normally use the breathe as our anchor in the here and now. This focusing on breathing helps to calm the body by slowing heart rate, lowering

blood pressure and improving focus. Children will understand at this stage that this controlled breathing helps their PFC work by calming their amygdala and allowing them to make mindful decisions.

Scoil Mhuire will facilitate parental training in this area next term. In the meantime, MindUP have a very comprehensive website www.mindup.org that explains the rationale and outlines some of the practices. Your children should be able to tell you about it and might even show you how to do a brain break!

Infants to Second class are using the PM books on a regular basis. These books are valuable and if they are lost, parents will be required to replace them. We have also invested heavily in teacher training to implement a programme called Reading Recovery. Reading Recovery is an early intervention designed to reduce literacy problems through early intervention. We are seeing significant improvement across all areas of reading as a consequence of these interventions including one of the most important metrics of all- Children's enjoyment.

ICT in Scoil Mhuire

Fourth class have begun an 8 week course in Computer coding. Coding, in simple terms, involves telling a computer what to do through a string of typed instructions. It could be anything from the instruction "print 'hello world'", to developing the code used for logging on to Facebook, withdrawing money from an ATM, or even blasting a rocket into space. All rely on instructions de-

veloped by a coder or programmer. The benefits of this course are manifold and extend well beyond the realm of computers.
