CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK

Dublin has been chosen by Pope Francis to host the World Meeting of Families 2018. From 21–26 August 2018, families and others from all over the world will gather to celebrate their lives together, to share their experiences from different parts of the world, to reflect on the different challenges they face and to grow together in faith. This event presents a special opportunity for school families to celebrate not only the fact that parents are the primary educators of their children but also the vital role that Catholic schools play in assisting parents. In partnership with World Meeting of Families 2018, the Catholic Schools Week Steering Committee has developed a oneyear catechetical programme for Catholic primary and post-primary schools. The theme for this programme is Catholic Schools: Called to be a Family of Families. The programme invites Catholic schools to reflect on and celebrate the relationship that exists between home, school and parish through participation in four sub-themed catechetical moments. NOTES FOR ABSENCES

When a child is absent from school, parents must sent a note to the teacher to explain the reason for the child's absence. Parents may like to fill in the notes at the back of the journal or write their own note if they prefer. It is really important that the reason for the absence is given for example illness etc...

Schools must collect this information and if a child is absent for twenty days or more in any school year the school must report this information to TUSLA (The Child and Family Agency) and must give details of the reason for the absences. If parents send in a note that the child was absent on eg January 9th and do not give a reason the school must record that as an unexplained absence.
