Accelerated Reader is set to begin this week in all classes from 3rd to 6th class.

Reading is a skill and, as with every skill, it requires not just instruction but practice. Reading practice serves a number of purposes. It enables pupils to apply the skills and strategies that you teach. It gives you opportunities to check pupil learning and identify weaknesses. And it draws pupils into the world of "real" reading - a world in which people learn from and enjoy books. Practice does not automatically lead to growth, however, to be effective, practice must have certain attributes: It must be at the right level of difficulty, cover a sufficient amount of time, be guided by the instructor, and be enjoyable enough to sustain.

The purpose of Accelerated Reader is to enable powerful practice. It does this by:

- Providing data that helps us to monitor and personal—ise reading practice.
- Encouraging substantial amounts of practice, according to guidelines based on research findings.
- Making practice fun for pupils by facilitating successful encounters with text

.The importance of daily personalised reading practice cannot be overstated. Recent studies indicate that when students spend 25 minutes a day reading suitably challenging books which they successfully comprehend (demonstrated by achieving 90% or more on the reading practice quiz), then they will achieve optimal reading age growth. This is the power of personalised practice. Scoil Mhuire has invested considerable time and resources in adapting Accelerated Reader for our school and we hope that it proves to be as successful here as it has proven to be in other countries.

Spellings

These are some tips to help you to support your child when they are learning their spellings:

- Parent and child to discuss the known parts and the "tricky" parts of words to be learned.
- Parent calls out words and child writes them.
- Parent looks at written attempts. Parent does not inform child how many are correct. Parent praises es the effort and then asks the child to check them.
- Child reports back to parent stating how many are correct.

 If child makes an error, the parent asks about the letters that are correctly written and then draws attention to the incorrect parts.

Literacy Lift off

Literacy Lift off has started in Second class. Our focus is on comprehension and writing and therefore children may be reading at a level below their decoding level. The children will be encouraged to bring home highly familiar books and read them to you. This is to encourage a sense of mastery and confidence and is known to be a highly effective methodology to promote good reading practice.

Science Week

Science week took place last week and this week and classes conducted a variety of scientific investigations. Our resident scientific expert, Ms Ann Keogh provided classes and teachers with support in this vital curricular area.

Debating

Last Monday, Ms Margret Martins came to our school and gave us a workshop on debating. We learned that when you are debating, there is a motion to discuss a particular topic. For every motion, there are two teams, with 3 member on each team. Each team has a captain. One team proposes a motion and the other team opposes it.

We learnt how to refute other members' statements. Everyone love it!

We are entering a debating competition in Galway.
We will go up against 16 schools.
