CREDIT UNION QUIZ

On Saturday 29th February Scoil Mhuire's Credit Union Quiz Team travelled to the Clybaun Hotel in Galway for the second round, having qualified from the Connemara stage on February 7th. There was stiff competition on the night, but Scoil Mhuire's team achieved their highest ever place in the competition to date. The team was tied second and unfortunately lost out on the tie breaker by one point ending in 3rd position. Our team members all come from 5th class, Amy Heffernan, Daragh Conroy, Jamie Linnane and Rian King. The team substitutes were Ella Prauer and Cara O'Donoghue. Congratulations to all concerned.

AR IN SECOND CLASS

Second class were incredibly excited to begin AR last week. This is an outline of how we use AR in Scoil Mhuire. There is a process behind how each child uses the program in school. Here are the steps typically involved: Teachers use a Star Reading test to determine each student's reading level. This program provides a multiple -choice assessment that takes students about 20 minutes on a computer. Teachers can also use results from other assessments or their own judgment. Each student is assigned to a specific range of books on the program's BookFinder list. We have boxes of books that correspond to a ZPD range. Books in that range will be challenging for the student but not too hard to read. This concept is called a zone of proximal development (ZPD). In AR, it is used to guide book selection. Students choose a book that is in their ZPD. A teacher may help with selecting books. AR recommends that children spend about 30 minutes in school each day reading their books independently.

After finishing a book, the student takes a short, multiple -choice online quiz. It checks if the student has read the book and understands it. Students usually take their quizzes in the classroom or library during the designated reading time. Students usually stay at the same ZPD and reading level for a set time. That is usually a marking period. In Scoil Mhuire it usually a term. At the end of that time, students take a 20-minute reading assessment. It is used to adjust the books that each student can select. A teacher may also raise or lower a child's ZPD for the next marking period.
