Scoil Mhuire is deeply concerned by the poor attendance of some of our pupils. There are a significant number of pupils who have missed more than 30 days. We will be sending letters to the parents of these pupils outlining the extend of their children's absenteeism. These letters will offer support to families who are experiencing difficulties getting their children to school. Poor school attendance is strongly associated with impaired
